Members of the Saskatoon Police Service searching for a strategy for gang reduction and repetitive missing children saw the need to reach out to children at a younger age (11 and under). They applied for funding from the National Crime Prevention Centre and were awarded a grant for a 5 year term project.

The Strengthening Families Program will be implemented using this funding. It is a family strengthening program for high risk families that is recognized internationally over 25 countries.

The Strengthening Families Program will be implemented by the Saskatoon Police Service in 2017.



Dear Members of the Board:

In the media, there have been articles and discussions re reducing the cost of policing the City by using civilian staff for various functions currently performed by members of the Saskatoon Police Service and have a suggestion to add to the possible options that the Board may be considering.

It is my understanding that members of SPS respond to all calls, including very trivial ones such as the theft of lawn ornaments, break-in of small garden sheds, etc. I believe that the other major prairie cities do not respond in person to minor complaints and that these incidents are reported by phone or via the internet. If these calls were routed to another reporting option, then the officers would have the time to respond more rapidly to serious calls. It might be appropriate to have the administration of the phoned-in or internet reports administered by civilian staff.

It seems to me that the number of guns involved in criminal activities in Saskatoon has escalated in the last five years and I am greatly concerned for officer safety, even for trained members of SPS. I believe that it would be unsafe to have untrained civilians engaged in police work where they would interact with the public outside of the police station.

that there is a public and private


face to all jobs. The conversation in a nursing staff room would curl your hair some days! Hey, we all need to vent.

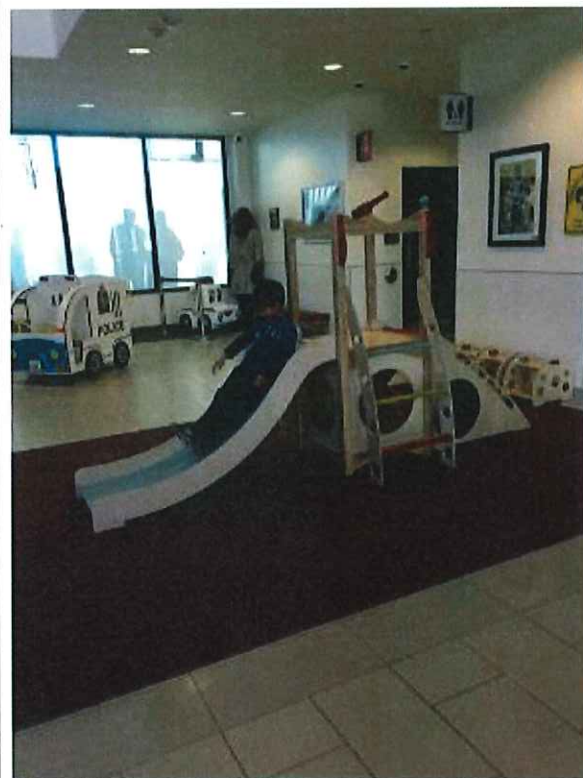

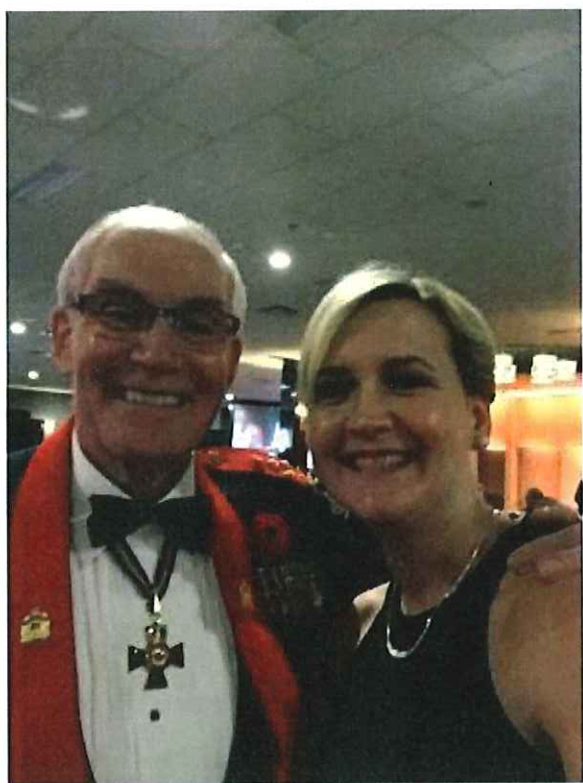
