SASKATOON PUBLIC LIBRARY

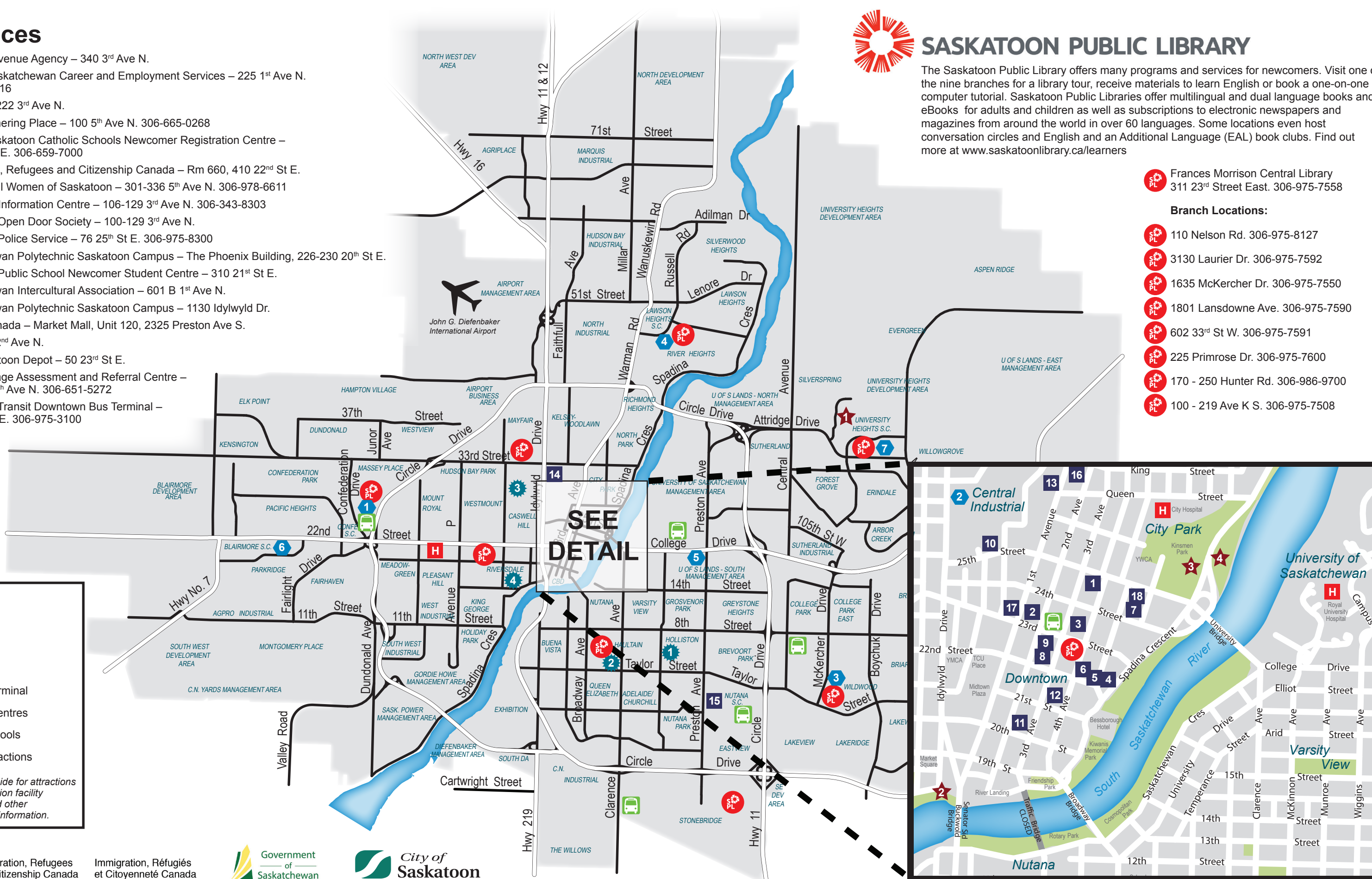

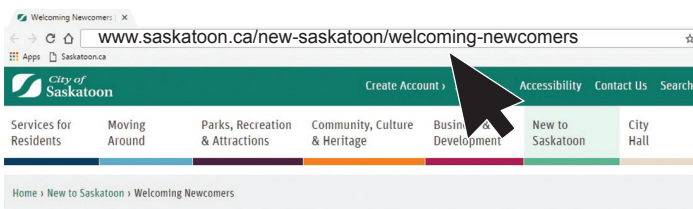
