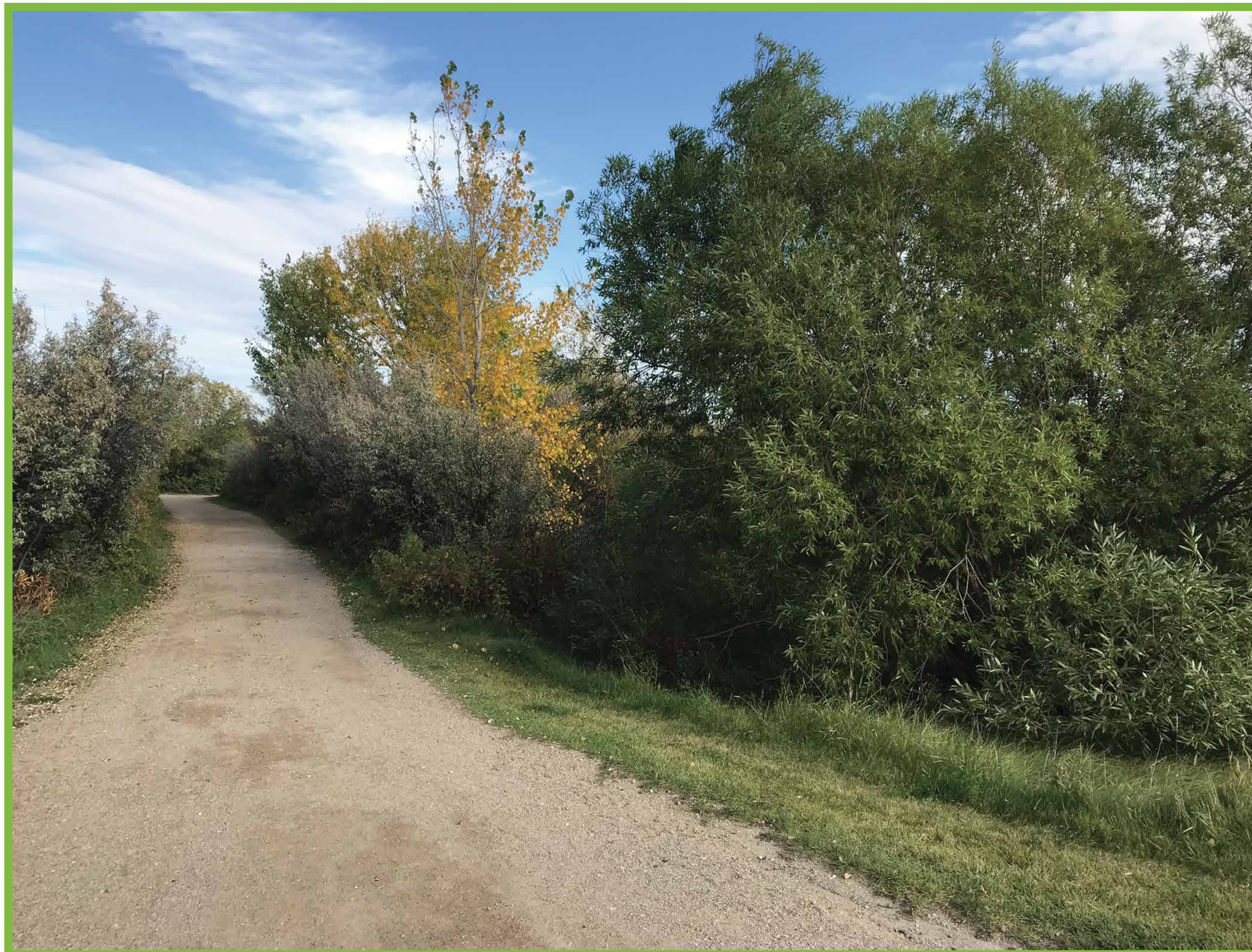

Pathways & Lighting

A new pathway will be added to connect one end of the park to the other. For safety purposes, dark sky compliant lighting will be installed along the pathway. All lit pathways are cleared of snow within 48 hours of snowfall in the winter.

Proposed Construction Schedule

Construction for the Robert Hunter West Park Upgrade Project is expected to be completed in 2024. Most of the park will need to be closed throughout construction and the establishment of newly planted areas. A detailed construction schedule will be confirmed when the tender is awarded in the Spring.

What to Expect

- Once park closure dates are known, they will be communicated to the River Heights Community Association and area residents
- Construction fencing will be installed to separate the construction zone from the public
- A site safety review will be conducted before construction begins
- Detour routes will be identified for pedestrians who typically walk or bike through the park
